Let's Think Together, Crime Victims

Let's learn about the situation of crime victims.

Victims of crimes and their families suffer not only from direct damage such as loss of life, injury, and theft of property, but also secondary damages such as

- Mental shock from being victimized
- Economic deprivation due to the burden of medical expenses, loss of job or job change
- Stress caused by rumors and news reports from people around them



Let's do what we can do.

Becoming a victim to a crime can happen to anyone.

It is important to understand that anyone can be a victim of a crime, and to understand the situation that victims are in, and to try to speak and act from their standpoint.

To those who have moved (or are thinking of moving) due to becoming a victim of a crime

Yamaguchi Prefecture subsidizes the cost of moving to a new residence for those who have become victim to murder, sexual crime, or bodily injuries.

Requirements : Must have been living in the prefecture at the time of crime, and must have suffered the damage at or near home etc.

Amount of subsidy : Up to 200,000 yen (limited to actual expenses)

Any nationality or gender.
